Safety Requirements and Guidelines for FAITH FORMATION MINISTRIES AND PROGRAMS During the COVID-19 Pandemic

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Introduction

Dear Pastors and Parish Leaders,

Our mission as the Office of Catechesis and Evangelization is to support you in your work to spread and strengthen the Faith in our diocese. In light of the pandemic, many of you have asked for guidance on how to conduct certain ministries

At this time, Faith Formation ministries are **Not Permitted to meet in person. Instead they should be conducted to the best of their ability via a distanced-based ministry model.**

We understand how frustrating this feels. The work of the Church must go on, but at this time we must do everything in our power to keep our Church's open for worship and to protect the most vulnerable among us. We have worked hard to develop the following guidelines to assist you so that you can minister to your people as *effectively* as possible given the challenging circumstances.

Given the rapidly changing nature of the current situation, the guidelines set forth in this document are subject to change. Deference should always be given to the most recent communications from the Diocese of Covington. Visit CovDio.org frequently to remain updated.

Requirements vs. Guidelines.

Throughout this document an important distinction is made between *requirements* and *guidelines*. **Requirements** are obligatory policies and compliance with them is expected. **Guidelines** are suggested best practices to enact whenever possible and prudent.

Part 1: Distanced-Based Ministry: Requirements

At this time, all Faith Formation Ministries and Programs **are required to** adopt a distance-based ministry model. The requirements and guidelines regarding distance-based ministry are described in Part 1.

Part 2: Resources and Guidelines



Part 1: Distanced-Based Ministry

At this time, all Faith Formation Ministries and Programs **are required to** adopt a distance-based ministry model. The following are the diocesan requirements and guidelines for operated Faith Formation ministries via a distanced-based model.



REQUIREMENTS

Obligatory: Compliance is Expected



Safe Environment Requirements

1. Diocesan Safe Environment Policies still apply even when using a distance-based ministry model:
 - ALL volunteers and catechists, even if conducting their ministry virtually, must be VIRTUS trained and current.
 - Whenever conducting a Virtual Video Meeting with underage individuals at least 2 VIRTUS trained and current individuals must be in attendance at all times.
 - Even if all individuals are overage it is still highly recommended that 2 VIRTUS trained adults be present

 - Never record or share videos of underage individuals without explicit, written permission from their parents or guardians.

Part 2: Resources and Best Practices

Introduction:

Even amidst the challenges of a distanced-based approach to ministry, we want you to be equipped to effectively reach your people. As a response to the quarantines and the pandemic, many high quality Catholic resources have been made more readily available for parishes to help them keep their parishioners engaged in the life of the Church. Moreover, many dioceses, parishes, and ministries have developed best practices for keeping parishioners engaged despite the widespread fear, confusion, and isolation. We have sought to gather some of these resources and best practices and list them for you here.



Live streaming:

One of the most effective ways to minister distantly is through live streaming-i.e. through live video and audio over the internet. Although not as optimal as in-person ministry, live streaming is the most effective way to be as “present” as possible virtually. Whether it is Mass, a bible study, a book study, a prayer group, or RCIA, if distance-based ministry becomes a necessity, **our first suggestion is to move to live streaming your event or ministry.** Below are some resources on how to effectively livestream your liturgy or event.

- **Reminder: Even prerecorded communication should never be sent directly to any underage individual unless safe environment approved. - **Reminder: Photographs and videos of Underage Youth Should NEVER be recorded and published online (without parental consent).**

Utilizing Social Media:

Social Media (Facebook, Instagram and Twitter), can be an effective way to:

- Stay in contact with your community,
- Support your community
- Keep your community engaged in the Faith
- Help your community still feel connected with your ministry and parish.

Consider recruiting a volunteer to serve your parish or ministry as Social Media Coordinator by:

- Creating and managing your social media accounts
- Posting daily and Sunday liturgies
- Sharing important updates (Church hours, Pandemic Updates, etc.)
- Livestreaming adoration
- Sharing pictures of the parish & community grounds
- Posting encouraging video messages and updates from the pastor, parish and ministry leaders
- Posting quotes from daily readings, daily saints, novenas, or a quality Catholic book or resource
- Suggest quality Catholic books and free online resources
- And more!

Important Reminders:

- **Underage individuals can never be contacted directly via social media.**
- Be extremely cautious of hackers by:
 - Using strong passwords, never sharing them, and changing them frequently
 - Never clicking a suspicious link sent to you via social media messengers
 - Making no more than one or two people you trust admins of your social media
 - Removing people as admins when they no longer serve the role

Call, E-mail, or Physical Mail Campaign:

If public masses must be restricted again or if you notice that your parish or ministry's attendance level has dramatically reduced, you may consider conducting a call, email, or physical mail campaign. Several Dioceses and Parishes have been suggesting such campaigns in order to reach the people of their community, assure them the Church is praying for them, let them know the hours the Church is open, and ask for their prayer intentions.
